Bonsai Outreach

The August Rocky Mountain Bonsai Society had a unique opportunity to teach a group about bonsai. A Colorado Housing and Finance Authority team that works with affordable rental housing reached out in hopes to learn and create a unique bonsai for each team member to enjoy in the home office. Patrick Allen helped alert us to this opportunity, and he and Rich Katz sources some wonderful ficus materials from Wigerts Bonsai Nursery, and Rich and I taught a fantastic beginner's course to the CHFA team.

The majority if not all of the beginning bonsai classes I have taught include students who sought out bonsai and were eager to learn. This was the first time I was involved in a class where a manager sought out the class for their team who was for the most part unaware of what bonsai is. The class was

very appreciative, and also terrified to begin working on their trees. While I often see students ready and eager to prune and wire a tree, it took a bit more instruction and examples for the class to gain more comfort working with the ficus materials. Additionally, the concept of trying to mimic old growth pushed by nature was a very new idea to most of the class. All of the students/ new bonsai practitioners left the class with huge smiles, and a wonderful little bonsai to begin their bonsai journey with. I think they will also have a new vision of trees in nature, and who knows, maybe a few will join the ranks of RMBS or make it to our annual show.

Speaking of the annual show, its almost show time! I hope you have been preparing your trees, and cleaning your pots to be ready. I for one am behind

schedule, but will be putting in some extra hours in the evenings this week to make sure I put my bonsai's best display forward. This has been a wild summer, so keep your bonsai sheltered, as the hail storms continue to keep us all on our toes.

Don't forget that volunteers and DBG members will gain access to the gardens for free during the annual show, but all others will need to pay admittance to the gardens to see the show.

This year the show will have close to 100 trees and several kusamono and suiseki viewing stones to enjoy and study. The Friday night celebration will be a great time to catchup and socialize, and there will be some great auction items as well. Don't forget to bring a meal for yourself, drinks and a water bottle. I look forward to seeing all of you there and cannot wait to see all the beautiful bonsai you all have been working so hard to prepare for the show!

RMBS show Volunteers Duties

We have about 50 volunteers committed to assisting with the RMBS annual show this year- thank you to everyone who stepped up! We know that a few of you will come and offer to help additionally.

These are the jobs and responsibilities; I will be sending out a final schedule of volunteers later this week.

Friday morning: 3-4 people needed to help pick up the Tokonoma and tablecloths from Adam Johnson's house in Boulder.

Friday, September 1, 9am-4pm: Show set up, a lot of moving parts – all hands needed!

Friday Night Celebration, September 1, 4-9pm: Assist with auction, set up and help with food or drink service, clean up, set up chairs after event in the demonstration area

Friday afternoon and some time on Saturday, September 1-2: Assist with photography – help move trees from their display area to the photo area, ensure the proper identification of orientation, etc.

Saturday, September 2, 4 hour shifts 9am – 8pm; Sunday, September 3, 4 hour shifts 9am-4pm

<u>Greeters</u>: Welcome visitors, provide information and directions, monitor front desk area.

<u>Security:</u> Roam tent to watch trees and stones for safety and security, water trees as requested, answer questions from visitors

<u>Tour Guides</u>: Experienced RMBS members take small groups of visitors through the show

<u>Demonstration assistance</u>: Help set up and take down demo displays, greet visitors, assist speaker as needed

Sunday, September 3, 4pm-completion

<u>Break down show</u>: Knock down tables and displays, pack Shoji screens and other club show materials, clean area

Collect and pack tablecloths and runners

Return the boxes of display items and Tokonoma to Adam Johnson's house in Boulder- Still need a few helpers. Leave DBG late afternoon.

A few things to know:

You must have a "volunteer" badge or be a member of DBG to be able to enter without paying the entrance fee. Badges will be available in Friday to be picked up. Friday night celebration is the exception- enter through the Pinon Gate.

Please see the flyer for the Friday night celebration attached below for food and drink info. We have some really nice auction items as well including some outstanding trees.

Please check in with the Greeter desk when reporting for your volunteer duty.

Review the email sent out with the information about identifying your tree, kusamono, or stone for the photographer.

If you are not going to be present for the show and have a tree on display, please make arrangements with one of the volunteers to water it for you.
