# Rocky Mountain Bonsai Society Show – September 1-3, 2023

There has been a lot of planning in place for our upcoming show Sept 1-3, 2023 at the Denver Botanic Gardens.

Tree, Stone and Kusamono Registration will begin August 1 and close around August 27. Watch for the email with the registration links coming soon.

Due to the success at last year's show, once again there will be a dedicated display area for Suiseki and for Kusamono to be exhibited as a stand-alone piece and not used as an accent stone or plant for a bonsai.

As some of the bonsai trees have gotten larger and take up more display area than others, the registration process will ask you to estimate the amount of the display table your tree may need so we can plan the layout of tables and provide enough space to accommodate as many trees as possible.

There will be a designated secure area set aside for members to leave their watering cans, supplies, etc. out of the public view in the tent.

We have not finalized plans for the Friday Night Celebration, but will have both a silent and live auction. Please contact Connie Garrett at <a href="mailto:cagarrett@earthlink.net">cagarrett@earthlink.net</a> if you've items to donate. As at previous shows, we will have a social meal time so bring your own entrée and BYOB; RMBS will provide non-alcoholic beverages as well as desserts and appetizers.

#### Volunteers Needed

Get involved with your fellow RMBS members, meet new people, talk about their trees, your trees, learn, socialize, have fun! Our weekend show is a great opportunity to get together with others who share your passion for Bonsai.

Thursday, August 31 evening: 3-4 people needed to pick up the Tokonoma and tablecloths from Adam's in Boulder. A truck with a trailer will be needed.

Friday, September 1, 9am-4pm: Show set up, a lot of moving parts – all hands needed!

Friday Night Celebration, September 1, 4-9pm: Assist with auction, set up and help with food or drink service, clean up, set up chairs after event in the demonstration area

Friday afternoon and some time on Saturday, September 1-2: Assist with photography – help move trees from their display area to the photo area, ensure the proper identification of orientation, etc.

Saturday, September 2, 4 hour shifts 9am – 8pm; Sunday, September 3, 4 hour shifts 9am-4pm

<u>Greeters</u>: Welcome visitors, provide information and directions, monitor front desk area.

<u>Security:</u> Roam tent to watch trees and stones for safety and security, water trees as requested, answer questions from visitors

<u>Tour Guides</u>: Experienced RMBS members take small groups of visitors through the show

<u>Demonstration assistance</u>: Help set up and take down demo displays, greet visitors, assist speaker as needed

#### Sunday, September 3, 4pm-completion

<u>Break down show</u>: Knock down tables and displays, pack Shoji screens and other club show materials, clean area

#### Collect and pack tablecloths and runners

Please let me know what days and time you are available and the type of duties you would be willing to perform. We will be issuing a schedule in the next few weeks. It is very helpful to know that all positions will be covered for planning purposes even though I know many of you are available to pitch in at any time you are present. Please note the meeting date is not Tuesday, but Thursday due to some conflicts with the Denver Botanic Gardens.


The presenter will be RMBS member and professional bonsai artist Todd Schlafer!


